CHOSEN? Reading the Bible Amid the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

Utilizing Walter Brueggemann's book, we will spend 5 sessions exploring the long-standing conflict in Israel and Palestine as we seek to better understand the issues and appropriate Christian responses. Additional resources will also be provided during these sessions, including a look at the resolution passed at this year's General Synod and the resolution of witness submitted for consideration at next year's Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting.

The study will be held on the five Tuesday evenings in September beginning at 5:30pm and lasting approximately 75 minutes. Copies of the book will be available from the church office by mid-August for \$12.


#### **BLOCK PARTY MUSIC**




