

Starting on January 5th we will have a new Interim Minister here at Christ Church. We are very happy that Pastor Bob will be among us. Here you'll find a brief biography and following that is Pastor Bob's responses to some questions that we asked him. Enjoy getting to know our new interim pastor!

Rev. Dr. Bob Gross, OCC, is a member of St. John's UCC, in Merton and has recently completed 16 months as an Intentional Interim Minister at First Congregational UCC in Janesville. He has served in five consecutive interims in the last 5 years and as a settled pastor in congregations in WI, OH, and NY, where he has served in various UCC Association, Conference, National capacities along with community leadership roles. Bob currently serves as the Chair of the Regional Support Team, for the Southern Region, of the Conference Committee on Ministry. He has served three terms on the Conference Board of Directors as Assistant Secretary and a member of the Governance Committee. Bob is a member and former Abbot of the Order of Corpus Christi, (OCC), a community of clergy and laity committed to prayer, study and the Eucharist. Bob and his wife Mary have two adult children who live with them. He enjoys time with his family, walks in the community, and sewing quilt tops for charity.

What have you learned from being an interim minister?

I've learned that I'm very comfortable with change and process, that congregations are often far more resilient than they think they are, that Interim Ministry is the work of bridge building, and you don't have the comfort of sitting on either shore, you must stand in the current.

What is a word that best describes you? Adaptable

What brings you joy?

Seeing the life changing work of God in the lives of my kids, people, and congregations, seeing youth get excited about God and church.

What kind of music do you like?

I appreciate a wide range of musical genres from Broadway (my current favorites are *Les Miserables*, *Wicked*, and *Hadestown*), to some '60's folk/country/rock, groups like The Grateful Dead, The Band, CSNY, and church music, hymns (*All Are Welcome*, *Forward Through the Ages*, *God of Grace and God of Glory*), choruses (John

Bell and those from Iona like *Take O Take Me As I Am* are some favorites), and some not so contemporary Christian music (Steven Curtis Chapman, Amy Grant, and Sandy Patty).

Any hobbies? Favorite books? Movies?

My hobby is sewing quilt tops. I have sewn for more than 20 charity.

I enjoy reading. Most often that means listening to an audiobook as I commute to and from the church. I have enjoyed murder mysteries. I am currently reading through William Kent Krueger's *Cork O'Connor* series. I also enjoy historical fiction like Ken Follett's *Kingsbridge* and *Century* series. Among the memoirs I've read in the last year are *Educated* by Tara Westover, *Between Two Kingdoms* by Suleika Jouad, and *Lovely One* by Katanji Brown Jackson. I slip a few Young Adult titles in there for something different, *Fourth Wing*, *Percy Jackson*, and others. That's probably more than you were looking for. If I were to list all time favorites, I would say, in no particular order, Dan Brown's *The DaVinci Code* (because it was a real page turner), *This Tender Land* by William Kent Krueger (because it took me on a journey), and Robin Wall Kimmerer's *Braiding Sweetgrass* (listening to the author tell her stories, connecting the natural world and science, and articulating a strong argument for increased earth care).

My all-time favorite is Star Wars (Episode 4, the first released).
