From the Pastor's Desk



To the members and friends of Christ Church,

It is with a heavy heart that I share with you the news that, after much prayer and discernment, I have submitted my letter of resignation as pastor and teacher of this church. My last day as your pastor will be on December 31, 2025.

While I have made several meaningful relationships and appreciated many of the experiences during my time at this church, I feel that I am no longer the right person to lead this congregation. It was communicated to me in the search and call process that this church needed someone to guide them through the Open and Affirming process and help them to reach out to the community. In my twenty-one-month tenure in this congregation, it has become increasingly apparent that many in this congregation are too comfortably esconced in the past to see and embrace the Bay View of the present or to discern the call of Christ to proclaim the gospel in this perilous moment in our country. I firmly believe that there is great potential for a progressive, welcoming, inclusive voice of faith in the Bay View community, but have become increasingly doubtful that Christ Church desires to be that voice. In recent conversations and encounters I have had with several members of this congregation, it has become clear to me that this church is not ready to make the changes necessary to adapt to the present-day realities and needs of area residents or to be honest regarding its true feelings toward members of the LGBTQIA+ community. There appears to be more concern about preserving the past (and the bank balances) than there is in proclaiming the gospel.

I do have some remaining time off and travel planned in the next three months, but aside from those weeks, I will continue to be present and serving as your pastor through the end of the year.




During the 130th Anniversary Celebration, Christ Church was recognized by the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee and presented with a plaque.



COUNCIL CORNER

The Finance Committee meets regularly each month to discuss monthly activity with the church Treasurer, Bookkeeper and Finance Secretary, along with other ad hoc members as well as a representative from the Endowments Committee. Some of the highlights from the past year included: adding monthly financial activity to the bulletin and newsletter, reviewed and revised our rental fee schedule of church space and fellowship hall, and modified the budget report to easily see the different fund activity. The Finance Committee also oversees the work of the weekly counters as well as identifying and training new counters as the need arises. The committee is currently in the process of preparing a budget for 2026 which will be presented at the annual meeting. The budget process involves working with each committee head to gather projections based on current expenses as well as anticipated needs. Finally, the Finance Committee wishes to sav "thank you" to all who contribute to the financial health of our church.

Love Will Not Be Silenced: Standing With Our Trans Siblings in a Season of Fear

Currently, trans people in America are being targeted in ways that are both chilling and familiar. The current administration and its allies are seizing on the tragic death of Charlie Kirk to justify labeling transgender people—and those who love and support them—as "violent extremists" and even "terrorists." The Heritage Foundation—the same group behind Project 2025—has even proposed creating a new category of domestic terrorism called "Transgender Ideology-Inspired Violent Extremism," despite the reality that trans people are far more likely to be victims of violence than perpetrators.

This is not about safety. It is about control. It is about creating fear so that people will shrink back, hide who they are, and silence themselves before anyone else has to. It is the politics of scapegoating and intimidation. And history tells us where that road leads.

But God does not call us to fear. God calls us to love. Again and again, Jesus embraced those the powerful tried to exclude and restored dignity to people pushed to the margins. When today's leaders demand that we abandon our trans siblings, our neighbors, and even our own children, we must say no. **We must tell the truth!**

The truth is clear: Trans lives are sacred. Trans people are made in the image of God. Trans joy, creativity, resilience, and beauty are not threats to our communities—they are gifts. And those of us who are cisgender, or who carry other forms of privilege, are called to stand shoulder to shoulder with trans people. Because an attack on one of us is an attack on all of us.

This moment is designed to make us small, to make us silent. But we cannot surrender. We must speak, march, write, preach, vote, and live in ways that tell the truth: God's love is stronger than hate, and God's justice is stronger than fear.

As the Open and Affirming Coalition, our commitment is clear. We will not be silent. We will not give in to fear. We will continue to equip churches and communities to affirm LGBTQ+ people, to proclaim God's expansive love, and to resist the powers of death with the power of life.

This is not the time to retreat. This is the time to rise up together and remember who and whose we are. Love will not be silenced. The challenges we face are overwhelming, but we are not powerless. The Open and Affirming Coalition is creating space for us to respond together—not with fear, but with courage and community. That's why we're launching **A.C.T OUT (Advocacy, Community, Transformation)**, a new initiative to help ONA churches move from affirmation to action.

A.C.T OUT: First Interest Meeting & Community Brainstorm

As anti-LGBTQ+ rhetoric and policies escalate, Open and Affirming churches are being called to do more than affirm—we're being called to act. A.C.T OUT (Advocacy, Community, Transformation) is a new Coalition initiative, and this first gathering is all about listening and brainstorming together. We'll share what our communities are facing, lift up what's already working, and dream about what A.C.T OUT could grow into—with no pressure and no commitments, just a chance to imagine and connect.
